

Traditional Owners: Widjabul

Scheduled Planting: 2021

Size: 29 hectares

Seeding Count: 625 - 2,500 trees/ha*

Partner: Envite Environment

Species: Tallowwood, Forest Red Gum, White Mahogany, White Bottlebrush, Sydney Blue Gum, Brush Box, Broad-Leaved Apple, and Hoop Pine.

*Seeding count will vary by elevation.



This land in Nimbin, NSW has been used to graze cattle and is generally steep and has been extensively cleared. At lower levels of the property there are dry rainforest species and also riparian areas.

Bound by Websters creek to the north west, the site has three National Parks (Nightcap, Border Rangers, and Mebbin) within 10km. It also intersects with the Websters Creek Subregional corridor.

Our goal is to provide additional corridor planting. Corridors allow species movement from one area to another and can provide a means of moving to habitats that support species development. The locations of corridors in the landscape can be critical, such as connecting ridge, slope and riparian habitats like those at this site.

We are hoping to increase habitat for endangered species, including koalas. We will also increase stocking in the dry rainforest area, which will improve biodiversity and encourage further natural regeneration.
